GFWC Montana Bylaws

Article XII – Conventions

Section 12. Representation. The voting body shall be accredited delegates or alternates from clubs in active membership.

- A. One delegate from each club of 10 members or fewer; one additional delegate for each additional 10 members, or major fraction thereof, based on per capita dues paid by March 20.
- B. In addition, the Board of Directors as defined in Article 6, Section 6.2, shall be entitled to vote by virtue of their office.

Section 12.3 Voting Members. All delegates, including the Executive Committee, shall pay registration for the entire convention to be entitled to vote. Though entitled to vote in several capacities, a voting member shall have but one vote. There shall be no absentee or proxy voting allowed.

Section 12.4 Non-Voting Members. Any member in active membership in GFWC may attend the biennial convention as a visitor. These members shall be required to pay the registration fee although they have no vote.

Section 12.5 Registration. The Executive Committee shall determine the biennial convention registration fees which shall be used to finance the convention. All in attendance shall pay registration fee. All election credentials shall be claimed by 6:00 p.m. on the day preceding the election.

Club Membership Retention

Seems like we all spend a lot of time recruiting new members. It is certainly important for us to continually get new members, who bring new ideas and a freshness to the work we do.

Equally important, though, is keeping the members we have. They lend experience and leadership to all our projects. They understand the work of the organization and are great teachers for those new members we recruit.

The GFWC Membership Quarterly lists these important practices your club can implement to enhance your retention rates:

- Engage your members Members who are actively participating in their club activities are those who will likely continue their membership. Engaged members participate in club activities, meetings, events, projects and club leadership. They feel a strong attachment to their club because they enjoy the friendships and fellowship that come with being a member of a woman's club. Methods of engagement include making members feel appreciated, establishing a mentoring program, requesting feedback from members about the direction/activities of the club, and encouraging members to assume leadership roles in projects.
- Know why members leave Clubs need to determine when and why members leave their club. Once clubs determine when and why members are leaving,

they need to generate strategies for keeping members. Clubs should then develop an action plan to retain membership. Discuss how to address areas of weakness and build on what the club is already doing well.

- The first year member Identify these members and develop a plan that will involve them in a project or committee that interests them. Ask them for feedback. Assign mentors.
- Club leadership Some clubs lose members because they fail to assign responsibilities to a variety of members or current long-time members continually take leadership roles. An effective club will delegate responsibilities to give more members the opportunity for service and recognition and provide opportunities for all members to use their talents and leadership skills.
- Club activities Clubs with a wide variety of activities will motivate a greater number of members than the club with limited projects.

The GFWC Billings Junior Woman's Club's Books for Babies Committee hosted a celebration for giving away "25,000 Books for 25,000 Babies" on February 12, 2018 at the Billings Public Library's Community Room.

Books for Babies...and You! began in January 2007 by delivering books to Billings Clinic Hospital one day a month. A committee member would call the Birth Center to find out the number of babies at the hospital on that day. Members then delivered a touch-and-feel board book, a handmade bookmark and magnet and a Billings Public Library Children's Story Times magnet to the babies and parents. St. Vincent Healthcare's Birth Center was added a few months later.

In September 2008 with the help of the Billings Friends of the Library, Billing Public Library, and GFWC/BJWC full time daily deliveries began. In October 2012 "10,000 Books for 10,000 Babies" was celebrated.

Book bags to the babies continue to include a touch-and-feel board book, a booklet "Books for Babies and...You!" that tells who, where and how a book may be read; an updated bookmark "Ten Reasons to Read to Your Baby," Billings Public Library Children's Story Time magnet, brochure telling about their "Books & Babies Lap Sit & Songs Read," a brochure giving information about the library plus a library application, a brochure from Early Childhood Intervention (ECI), and

a card giving information about GFWC/BJWC and donors are included.

The Books for Babies Committee's mission is to support and increase literacy in our community by developing and promoting education programs for children and families. The goals are to insure that books reach a large number of families, to put books in the hands of children, to encourage families to use the public library, to get parents to read & enjoy books with their children, and increase literacy.

Many grants, businesses, individual donors, and very supportive helpful members of the Books for Babies Committee have enabled us to continue giving – so far – 25,000 Books for 25,000 Babies.
