# President's Special Project Suicide Prevention Through Education

From Health Matters, Billings Gazette, Monday, September 7, 2020 by Sarah Music, Chairman of the Suicide Prevention Coalition of Yellowstone Valley.

"Our focus is to raise awareness of the risk factors and warning sign for suicide. Warning signs of suicide may include:

Expressing thoughts of death Increase in substance abuse Deterioration in hygiene Giving away possessions

Sleep problems Isolating Withdrawing Anger

Reckless behavior Depressed mood

OJM, An international Journal of Medicine states 'To reduce suicides during the COVID-19 crisis and after, it is imperative to decrease stress, anxiety, fears and loneliness in the general population.' Creating healthy habits, such as going for walks and drinking more water can help. Reaching out to a neighbor or friend will often lift their spirits and yours."

Locate and attend a Suicide Prevention Conference this fall. The opportunities for education are right among us and often at little or no cost.

# Karl Rosston, Suicide Prevention Coordinator, Montana Department of Public Health and Human Services

Karl Rosston provides evidenced-based programs to all Montana secondary schools, implements the State Suicide Prevention Plan, supports the Montana Suicide Prevention Lifeline, implements firearm safety programs and statewide media campaigns, provides suicide prevention trainings, and coordinates suicide prevention efforts around the state. Karl is adjunct faculty at the Montana Law Enforcement Academy and a nationally certified trainer in QPR and Mental Health First Aid.

Previously, Karl was the Director of Social Services at Shodair Children's Hospital in Helena. Before returning to Montana, he was on the faculty of the University of Colorado, School of Medicine, and a clinical consultant with the Colorado Division of Youth Corrections.

He is a licensed clinical social worker who maintains a small private practice in Helena. He received his Master's in Social Work from the University of Denver and his Bachelor's in Psychology from the University of Montana.

## The Junior Pledge

The Junior Pledge was written in 1916 by Helen Cheney Kimberly of California, and was adopted in 1930 at the GFWC Convention as the National Junior Pledge.

I pledge my loyalty to the Junior Club women,
By doing better than ever before
What work I have to do;
By being prompt, honest, courteous,
By living each day, trying to accomplish
something,
Not merely to exist.

### **GFWC of Montana**

The Collect used by women's clubs was written in 1904 by a young woman named Mary Stewart under the pen name Mary Stuart (used until 1920) leading to the confusion that it was written by Mary, Queen of Scots.

Mary was born in 1876 in Ohio and spent her child-hood in Georgetown, Colorado, high in the Rockies. When she was just out of college and starting her first job in 1904 as a high school principal in Longmont, Colorado, she was described as a little bundle of energy, dignity and personal charm.

Mary belonged to the Fortnightly Club, a Federated Club and forerunner of the Business and Professional Women's Club now in Longmont. Mary was part of the rapidly growing women's club movement, and she thought that her prayer might give club women a sense of unity.

Mary recalled: "It was written as a prayer for the day. I called it a 'Collect For Club Women' because I felt that women working together with wide interests for large ends was a new thing under the sun, and that perhaps they had need for special petition and meditation of their own."

The first women's organization to use the Collect was the General Federation of Women's Clubs. The Collect spread nationwide, and soon it was being used by women's groups throughout the world.

Mary Stewart continued to work with women's groups and was active in the woman's suffrage movement. She held several special teaching posts in Colorado and for eight years she served as Dean of Women at the University of Montana also teaching Latin and English. In 1921, she became a guidance and placement officer in her position as Assistant Director of the newly formed US Employment Services of the Department of Labor. From 1928 until 1942, Mary served as Assistant Director of Education in the office of Indian Affairs, Dept of Interior.

In 1927, Mary Stewart's alma mater, the University of Colorado, gave her an honorary Master's degree to recognize her distinguished work in education, social and civic service. She kept active in women's clubs until her death in Ohio in 1943 at the age of 67.

Today, we honor Mary Stewart and her Collect for Club Women — a beautiful prayer that lives on wherever women's clubs gather.
